



The syllabus is based on the guidelines set by the Inter State Board for Anglo Indian Education, New Delhi.

Recommendation to Guardians

In order to secure all that is best in the education of the child, maximum co-operation between parents and school authorities is desired. We earnestly recommend that parents or guardians should look into their child's school diary everyday and see to it that the lessons and home work assigned for the next day is done. The child should be encouraged to cultivate neatness habitually and slovenliness should be firmly disapproved of. Remark or reports made in the diary, should be seen and countersigned regularly.

Parents must please see that their children are provided with necessary books and stationery. Neither borrowing nor lending is allowed in the School.

Should you feel that your child is not making the desired progress, the Principal should be contacted. Private tuitions are strongly discouraged. However, if there is real need of a private tutor, consult the Principal.


Parents are requested not to visit the teacher or the pupils during class hours. All business will be transacted in the office on appointment.

Criticism of a teacher or the School, in the child's presence should be avoided, because it makes the child lose respect for his/her teacher with the consequent failure to learn from him or her. Should you have a legitimate complaint, see the Principal.

As your child advance in age, guide him/her to become a resourceful and useful member of home & country. Encourage self help for work and study. He/she should be taught to do some house work. The inculcation of such habits, early in life makes him/her learn the dignity of labour.

Withdrawal of your child from class for mere social functions is not recommended, because it retards the child's progress in school and minimizes his/her interest for regular hard work, with consequent failure to progress in his/her studies.

Should there be any infectious disease in your family, please report the fact to the Principal at once and do not send your child in the class, till the danger of infection has passed. A doctor's certificate permitting attendance at school, should be produced. If your child fails to produce such certificate, he/she may be sent home during school hours.

"Discipline is the continued exercise of the will, enlightened by the intellect, so that it may act easily and habitually according to Right order and help the child to attain SELF MASTERY".


Hence the school expects every child to contribute to discipline of the School.

PUNCTUALITY

- Every pupil is expected to be in School 5 minutes before the Assembly Bell. If pupils are late, they will receive two warning notices and after that they are liable to be sent home at the parents own risk.
- At the first bell, all are expected to stop wherever they may be, while the teachers proceed to the place of ASSEMBLY or Class-Rooms to receive their pupils. The pupils use the PAUSE to compose themselves and prepare for the WORK SHIFT.
- No student who is absent or is late in school, will be admitted to the class by Teacher Incharge, without Principal's Signature.

SILENCE

- Special care must be taken by teachers and pupils to preserve an ATMOSPHERE OF SILENCE AND SERIOUS WORK during class hours.

ORDER



- Running, playing, shouting and whistling inside the school building is not allowed.
- When moving along corridors from one class to another, the rule is always KEEP LEFT and respect classes at work by moving with no noise.
- No pupil is permitted to enter the Teachers Staff Room or Teachers Quarters.
- No child will be permitted to run errant during class hours, nor will a child be permitted to come to the Principal's office during class hours, except for a justifiable or urgent reason.
- Pupils must not remain in the classroom during the recess.
- Pupils may use the telephone with permission, in urgent cases.
- Books, Newspapers, Periodicals and Magazines are not allowed to be brought in the school, without the knowledge and sanction of the Principal. Such magazines are liable to be confiscated.
- No collection for any purpose whatsoever may be made in the school, without the permission of the Principal.





COURTESY

- Pupils shall always greet their Teachers, elders and friends in a pleasant and audible tone of voice, wherever they meet them, in school or outside.
- They shall maintain good posture whenever they sit, stand or walk.
- They shall be polite in speaking to one another, avoiding use of slang and unpleasant expressions.





SCHOOL CLEANLINESS

- All must consider in their social responsibility to keep the school premises clean.
- Every child must be particularly careful to avoid throwing waste paper, fruit-peels outside, through school windows or on the school grounds. Use should be made of the waste paper baskets and bins provided for this purpose.


